Topic: Research Beyond BAU: "Brundtland As Usual"

Consolidating 40 years of Sustainability in Tourism research in the Netherlands, this session engages with the professional doctorate (PD) and the famous proclamation on sustainability about "meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs" is attributed to the former Norwegian primeminister Gro Harlem Brundtland in 1987. At current this dictum holds true and is well established, but it is time to move beyond parroting it and explore what sustainability in tourism, leisure and hospitality means today and how society can transition to such a state. For the third annual iteration of the #NLTRN we are keen to further build dialogues, knowledge and trust across the diverse field of tourism and hospitality research in the Netherlands. The challenges facing society at large and tourism and hospitality in particular are well known and in this session, held in relation to the launch of the graduate network of those doing professional doctorate (PD), we explore how to move all aspects of tourism research beyond Brundtland as usual with a particular focus on equity and the <u>role of the professional doctorate</u>.
